Speakers at the INGEDE Symposium 2016

Martyn Eustace:
MD Print Power
Europe Ltd



Print is not dead! Print is advantageous to electronic media! Martyn Eustace of Two Sides UK will give a keynote presentation at the upcoming INGEDE Symposium on 24th February in Munich, Germany.

Martyn will review consumer attitudes towards print media as well as explain the Two Sides and Print Power campaigns which inform both consumers and media specifiers about the attractiveness, sustainability and incredible effectiveness of print and paper in a multi-channel world.

Biography

During his long career in the paper industry, Martyn Eustace has gained a wealth of experience having held a variety of senior management positions. After a period in paper manufacturing with Domtar, Martyn moved to distribution as CEO of Howard Smith Paper and then later CEO of Premier Paper.

Martyn is a member of PwC turnaround panel and is Managing Director of Newvizion, an independent marketing consultancy. He is the Director of the sustainability organisation Two Sides and the Managing Director of Print Power Europe, an initiative to promote the sustainability and effectiveness of

the Graphic Communications Value Chain.

Martyn has been President of the UK Paper Industry Charitable Trust and President of the UK National Association of Paper Merchants (NAPM). He has served on the Board of EUGROPA, the European Paper Merchants Association and is presently a Council member of PRIMA.

Having held several positions in the area of raw materials at CEPI, his responsibilities in his current role of Raw Materials Director include the availability of raw material both from forestry and recycling and the policies impacting them.

Shisei Goto

In Japan, paper recycling is similar to Europe, still there are some differences in the composition of the household collection. Hence there are also some differences in the evaluation. Shisei Goto of Nippon Paper will present about "The Assessment and development of easy-recyclable printing materials in Japan".



Biography

Shisei Goto studied chemistry in Hiroshima and made his PhD at the faculty of agriculture & life science at the University of Tokyo. Since 1995 he has been working at NPi Research Laboratory at Nippon Paper Industries Co.,Ltd. He is now senior research manager and head of process technology research group.

He has many years experience in the

research fields wet-end chemistry, colloid & surface chemistry and deinking & paper recycling. He received lots of awards for his work. In 2014 he was honoured with the TAPPI Journal Best Research Paper Award for 2014 for his paper about "Cavitation-jet deinking: A new technology for deinking of recovered paper" and in 2013 he got the Wayne Carr best paper award and the Best paper of Japan Tappi J., both on cavitation deinking, as well.

Thierry Delagoutte

Adhesives from recycled paper can lead to sticky deposits in the paper machine. Fully dispersible/soluble adhesives might be an alternative when removable products are not available. Thierry Delagoutte of CTP presents a new test method to assess the dispersible character during repulping and simple tests including colloidal stability evaluation and possible control by process additives. This method is being developed in the course of an INGEDE Project.



Ulla Forsström of VTT (Finland) will present the EU-funded REFFIBRE Project where tools will be developed for the paper and board industry that can instantly provide the needed information regarding the impact of new production processes, raw material input and product innovations, as well as the influence on the recyclability of the end product. The tools enable paper makers to consider innovations affecting profitability in the value chain.



Antje Kersten from the University of Darmstadt will present the INGEDE Project 145 14 "Entrance quality control of recovered paper regarding deinkability of printed products by FT-IR spectroscopy".

Ulrich Höke will give an update on INGEDE's activities and an Outlook. **Manfred Geistbeck** will talk about the work of working group Paper for Recycling and **Anne Klar** will outline the challenge in using higher grades of paper for recycling working group Deinking Process. **Axel Fischer** will give a presentation about public relations and digital printing.

INGEDE Member Survey 2016

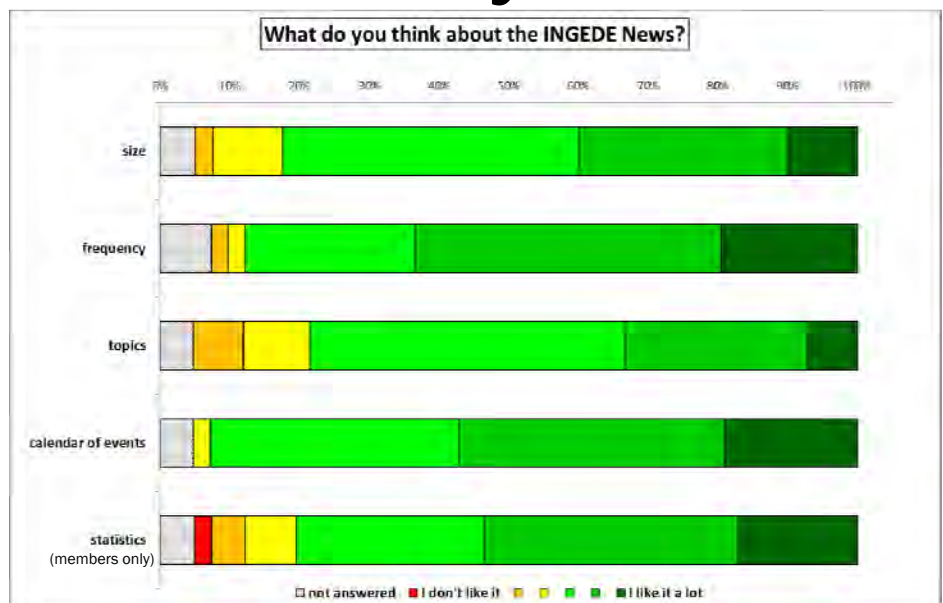
In January INGEDE conducted a Member Survey. Our motives: We want to find out on which topics the members are interested in. The results are very interesting and they help INGEDE's work a lot.
