

# The new European Project: IMPACTPapeRec

In the framework of Horizon 2020 and IMPACT, an initiative within the European Innovation Partnership on Raw Materials, the project IMPACTPapeRec was approved by the European Commission. If you know the meanings of the acronyms, you can easily identify the project objectives: IMPACT stands for “Introduction and Improvement of Separate Paper Collection to avoid landfilling and incineration” and PapeRec for “Boosting the implementation of participatory strategies on separate paper collection for efficient recycling”. It is planned to launch the project in November 2015 and finish by December 2017. For formal reasons, INGEDE is involved through Andreas Faul Papiertechnik.

The geographical focus will be on countries with low collection rates and/or commingled collection, namely Bulgaria, France, Poland, Romania and United Kingdom.

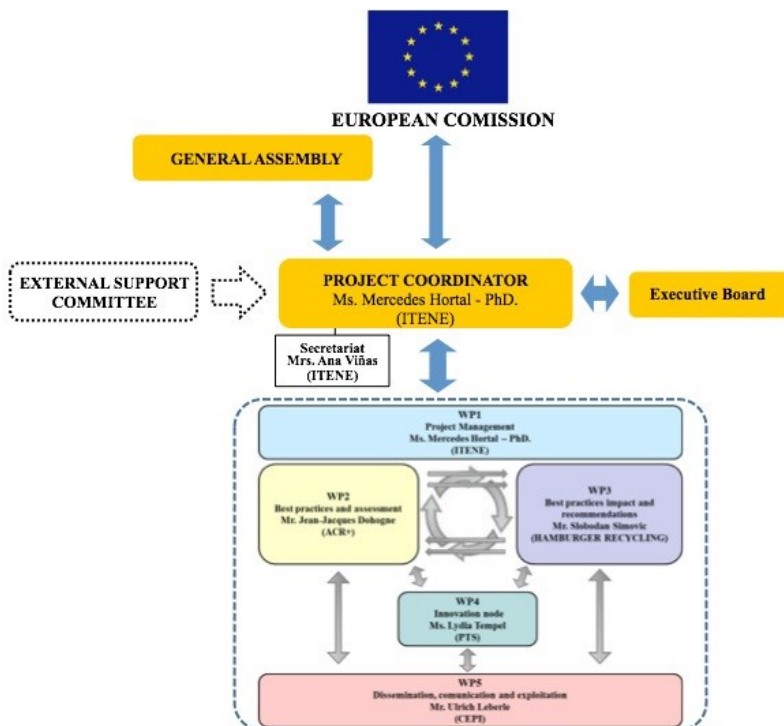
The five work packages are Project management (WP1, leader: ITENE), Best practice identification and as-

essment (WP2, leader: ACR+), Validation of the models, standards, policies and incentives (WP3, leader: Hamburger Recycling), Innovation node (WP4, leader: PTS) and Dissemination, communication & exploitation (WP5, leader: CEPI). The five work package leaders will form the Executive Board of the project.

The 21 project partners consist of research institutes, associations, paper companies and their subsidiaries (all of them from the packaging paper sector), organisations for waste management and collection, municipalities, retail and standardisation. In detail:

**ITENE (Instituto Tecnológico del Embalaje, Transporte y Logística, Spain)** is a R&D technological centre which is specialized in packaging, logistics, transport and mobility.

**CEPI (Confederation of European Paper Industries, Belgium)** is the organisation of the European pulp and paper industry, representing 18 national paper industry associations.

... **ACR+ (Association of Cities and Regions for Recycling and Sustainable Development, Belgium)** is an international network of cities and regions which share the aim of promoting smart resource consumption and sustainable waste management through prevention at source, reuse and recycling. It has around 90 members across EU Member States and neighbouring countries.

**SAICA (Sociedad Anónima Industrias Celulosa Aragonesa, Spain)** has three business sectors: Environmental services and waste collection, paper for corrugated board production and packaging production. SAICA is the biggest consumer of paper for recycling in Spain and France and is heavily involved in the collection of paper in both countries.

**Swiecie Recykling Sp. Z o. o. (Poland)** is a 100 % subsidiary of the Mondi Swiecie S.A. paper mill and purchases the paper for recycling for Mondi.

**Hamburger Recycling Group GmbH (Romania)** has its core competences in collection, treatment, trade and transport of paper for recycling.

**Stora Enso Narew SP. Z o. o. (Poland)** is a paper mill which produces paper for corrugated board.

**ECOFOLIO (France)** is a private non-profit company which levy a fee for free print products in France. With this fee they provide financial support for local authorities that are responsible for public waste management services. Also R&D projects are paid with this fee to improve the efficiency of paper sorting, collection and recycling systems.

**PTS (Papiertechnische Stiftung, Germany)** belongs to the major paper institutes worldwide. Their research cover the whole production chain from the raw material to the end product and also comprises recycling technologies.

**Andreas Faul Papiertechnik (Germany)** represents the interests of INGEDE.

**SC Tega S.A. (Romania)** is a company for public sanitation services and waste management.

**Fenix Dupnica LTD (Bulgaria)** collects, treats and disposes non-hazardous wastes.

**Jordan Krastitelski – JORADAN 2001 Ltd. (Bulgaria)** is collecting, separating and transporting almost all waste materials.

**CARREFOUR (Centros Comerciales Carrefour SA, Spain)** is a leading retailer in Europe.

**DIN (Deutsches Institut für Normung e. V., Germany)** is the German institute for standardisation.

**EEB (European Environmental Bureau, Belgium)** is the environmental voice of European citizens, standing for environmental justice, sustainable development and participatory democracy. Its remit for the EU is to ensure all citizens have a healthy environment and rich biodiversity.
